



How to Connect to Wireless Network

Option #1: CalVisitor

Guests to UC Berkeley can access the open wireless network, **CalVisitor**, for internet access from any Wi-Fi enabled device. **CalVisitor** provides free public Wi-Fi access on campus for those not affiliated with UC Berkeley.

Option #2: Eduroam

If a visiting scholar's home school takes part in the **Eduroam** program, they may use their home credentials to access the **Eduroam** Wi-Fi network.

What is Eduroam? **Eduroam** is a world-wide roaming Wi-Fi service for educational institutions. Users from any participating institution can use the **Eduroam** service at any other participating institution to obtain Wi-Fi network connectivity with minimal configuration. **Eduroam** users do not require guest passes; they use their own credentials provided by their home institution.

Eduroam for UCB Visitors: Visitors to UC Berkeley who come from an institution that participates in **Eduroam** will be able to use this Wi-Fi network without the need for additional configuration. Visitors using **Eduroam** will be provided with full access to the UC Berkeley network because they are authenticated using their institution's credentials.

Please note that PPTP is enabled on **Eduroam**, and some VPN clients may require you to enable NAT Traversal in the settings (this is rare).
